Speech and Language Information for Parents and Carers

Under 6s advice service: For children under 6 years of age, a telephone appointment is available for parents to discuss their concerns about their child's speech, language and communication development and to give guidance on whether further Speech and Language Therapy assessments are needed. No referral form is required for this service.

Limited face-to-face appointments are available on request. Please telephone 01535 292821 and speak to the administration team to book an appointment.

Early Identification Service: This service is for children under 3 years of age with the highest clinical support needs or with safeguarding needs. Referral is via health visiting teams.

Community SALT service: Children under 6 years old will be seen for further assessment by this team following their telephone appointment.

For children over 6 years, please complete a referral form and send to cdc.referrals@nhs.net. Health practitioners are able to refer electronically using SystemOne. Referrals are clinically triaged to ensure they meet the criteria or whether they are best assessed by the CDC team or needs can be met by other services.



Behaviour Policy and Behaviour Curriculum: This year, Mrs Maddocks and Miss Houghton, have been fortunate enough to take part in the RISE (Regional Improvement for Standards and Excellence) Attendance and Behaviour Hub Programme organised via the DfE. This programme aims to:

- support school leaders to reflect on current systems
- share effective practice
- implement changes

As a consequence, they have spent time reflecting and updating our current behaviour policy, which was approved by the Federation Governing Board (FGB) at a meeting on 22nd June 2026. Alongside, the policy we will be introducing a curriculum for behaviour. We have been introducing aspects of the new curriculum during the last few weeks of term and the children and staff have responded brilliantly.
