

House Keeping and General Information

The School Day: Breakfast Club: 8am - 8.45am (Monday to Friday); Start of day: 8.45am; Lunch: 12pm - 1pm (Including playtime); Home-time: 3.30pm; After School Care: Runs from the end of the school day to 5.30pm (Monday to Thursday). For booking, either or the Breakfast Club or After School Care, please use SchoolMoney. If parents are running late and we haven't heard from you, your child/ren will automatically be booked in with our After School Care provision until you can get here. Please remember to bring in PE kits on Monday, to be collected on Fridays each week, or left in school for the half term.

SchoolMoney (we are a cashless school): For our current parents, we hope that any outstanding payments due were cleared during the summer holidays. If you have anything still outstanding, we kindly ask if this can be paid in full as soon as possible (as a matter of urgency as all pupils should now have a £0 balance on their individual account). Thank you. Guidance on SchoolMoney is available on our website and you can also contact school if you need any assistance.

Milk: All pupils under the age of 5 are entitled to free school milk, however we also offer milk to all pupils throughout the school at a cost of 20p a day, to be paid half termly through SchoolMoney. Please email the school office at office@hellifielld.n-yorks.sch.uk to let us know if you want your child to have milk at playtime, even if your child/ren has been provided with milk previously. If your child is funded for Free School Meals (NOT Universal Free School Meals), we can provide this, but please still contact us to let us know if you haven't already.

Annual Consents: Instead of your being sent an Admin Pack to complete, this year you should have received a link to our new Annual Consent form. Please complete the form, one per child, as soon as possible, so we can update our records with any changes.

Friends of Hellifield: For our new families who have recently become part of our school, we are very proud of our Friends of

Hellifield Team (PTA). They are very active in supporting the school both financially and socially, through fundraising and events through the year, enabling us to enhance the education of our pupils through visits, resources and treats that wouldn't otherwise be possible. If you are interested in becoming involved, please don't hesitate to let us know and we can pass on your details and the Friends team can let you know when the next AGM is. A big thank you to all of our families who make these fundraising events so successful — we could not do this without you!

School Parking: We do have parking at the front of the school with limited spaces available, as this is used for staff and Chipmonks Day Nursery. Please continue to be considerate to our neighbours at the back of the school during drop off and pick up times. If you are driving, could you please park at the end of the road and try to avoid turning round by the gate to avoid congestion. Please do not let your child/ren scoot or cycle on the car park at the front of the school, as cars are coming in and going out throughout the day. Please only use the disabled parking space if you have a permit. Our aim is to keep everyone as safe as possible — thank you.

Clothing & Book Bags: Please label clothing to avoid uniforms being mixed up. We recommend Velcro shoes for our little ones. Please do not let your child/ren bring toys or objects into school or in their book bags, especially in Acorn Class, as their book bags need to fit into a slim tray. The only things the children need on a daily basis are: coat, water bottle with WATER in (no juice please) and any extra clothing kits, eg PE / swimming. This also includes packed lunches if they do not wish to have lunches provided by school. Our school dinners are very popular and ingredients are locally sourced and all of the meals are cooked fresh on site each day.

Swimming: Swimming blocks per class, will start this week for Years 4, 5 & 6 and will gradually filter through to each class, down to our youngest pupils in the summer term. Pupils are to bring swimming kits with them each Wednesday, including a towel (swimming goggles are optional and are the responsibility of the pupil). Please remove any earrings/watches/jewellery on swimming days. Transport will be provided by Bibbys of Ingleton and we will be leaving school after lunch on Wednesdays. Swimming tuition and transportation is provided by Sports Premium Funding.

Celebration Assemblies: These will take place each Friday, at 9am. You are invited to join us to celebrate your children's achievements each week. Please arrive and leave by Reception and sign in and wear a visitor lanyard on arrival.
