Starlings Class - World War II: Interest from the children in World War II. following this year's 80th VE Day celebrations, led to Starlings Class having a special visitor in May when Mrs Hannah Miller (Bea and Harriet's mum) came into school to talk to them about her grandfather and the part he played in the war. Mr Robert Owen, who was 19 when he left to fight in North Africa with the Army, also saw action in Italy during the famous Battle of Monte Cassino in 1944. Mr Owen received 5 medals, including the North Africa Star and the Italian campaign medal, and he was demobbed in 1946. Mrs Miller shared photos and a couple of the medals with the children.



Government help with Early Years Education and Childcare Costs

Working Parent Entitlement Age 9 months and over

Eligible working parents*

15 hours

30 hours

Up to August 2025 From September 2025

From September 2025, eligible working parents with children aged over 9 months up to 5 years will be entitled to up to 30 hours of government funded support with their childcare costs. Working parents entitlement can be combined with 2-year-old or 3 and 4-year-old offers to give a maximum of 30 hours per week.

2-Year-old Funding for Eligible Families

Eligible families receiving some additional form of Government support*

15 hours

2-year-olds may be eligible for up to 15 hours of government funding childcare if:

- You are in receipt of: Disablity Living Allowance (DLA), Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) or Income-related Employement and Support Allowance (ESA)
- You are in receipt of Universal Credit and your household income is £15,400 a year or less after tax, not including benefit payments.
- You receive the guaranteed element of Pension Credit.
- · The child has an Educational Health and Care plan (EHCP)
- The child is looked after by the Local Authority, has been adopted or has left care through special guardianship or child arrangement orders.

To apply for 2 year old funding, please visit www.northyorks.gov.uk/earlyeducationplaces

*Funding is available for 38 weeks per year and parents may be required to pay additional charges.

Government Funding

Funding begins the term after the child turns the relevant age. Your 15 or 30 hours can be used for 38 weeks of the year (term-time) or you may be able to stretch your hours over some of the holidays by using less hours each week during term time. Check with your early years provider to find out how they deliver government funded childcare in their setting. Please note, providers may ask for consumable charges in addition to the funded childcare offer.

Tax Free Childcare or Universal Credit childcare

Tax Free Childcare or Universal Credit childcare may be used whilst claiming your 15 or 30 hours of government funded childcare support. To see eligibility criteria for any of the government funding options, please scan the QR code or visit childcarechoices.gov.uk.


