SchoolMoney (we are a cashless school): For our current parents, we hope that any outstanding payments from the last school year were cleared during the summer holidays. If you have anything still outstanding, we kindly ask if this can be paid in full as soon as possible. Guidance on SchoolMoney is available on our website schoolmoney and you can also contact school if you need any assistance.



Breakfast Club: As you should be aware, we joined the Government's Breakfast Club Early Adopter Scheme earlier this year and we are seeing around 15 children per day using the club and enjoying a healthy start to the day with friends. If you haven't used the club so far but would like to try it, please contact the School Office and they can send you the Terms and Condition and a link to the Breakfast Club registration form. Children cannot attend the Breakfast Club until the registration form has been completed. The Breakfast Club is open to Children from Reception to Y6 and places can

be booked on SchoolMoney up to midnight the day before they are due to attend.

Children can join the Breakfast Club from 8am, for a payment of £2, or from 8.15am for free.



Milk: All pupils under the age of 5 are entitled to free school milk, however we also offer milk to over 5s in Robins Class at a cost of 20p per day, to be paid half termly through SchoolMoney. Please email the school office at office@longpreston.n-yorks.sch.uk to let us know if your child does not want to have milk during the morning session. Robins parents should have received an email about the milk payment, which has been added to SchoolMoney accounts where applicable.



Annual Consents: Continuing the change we introduced last year, instead of sending you an Admin Pack to complete each year, we have sent you a link to our Annual Consent Form. Please complete the form for your child/ren as soon as possible, so that we can update our records with any

Drop Off and Collection: Thank you for your continued support with our arrangements for drop off and pick up of the children...it's been much appreciated. Our school is situated on a single track public highway and we would politely ask that if you do need to drive to school, you take great care of pedestrians when doing so.



Please can we also remind parents and carers that it is their responsibility to ensure that their children are kept safe on their journey to and from school.



Clothing and Book Bags: Please label clothing to avoid items of the school unform being mixed up. We recommend Velcro shoes for our little ones to make it as easy as possible for them to take off and put their shoes back on themselves. Please do not let your child/ren bring toys or objects into school or in their book bags, especially Robins Class. The only things the children need on a daily basis are: coat, water bottle with water in (no juice please) and any extra clothing kits eg PE / swimming. This also includes packed lunches if they do not wish to have a lunch provided by school. Our school dinners are prepared fresh each day on site and ingredients are locally sourced.

Swimming: Swimming lessons are by class, per term. This means that Owls Class are having swimming lessons each Wednesday afternoon for the Autumn term, followed by Starling Class for the Spring term and finally Robins Class during the Summer term. Pupils are to bring swimming kits with them each Wednesday, including a towel (swimming goggles are options and are the responsibility of the pupil). Please remove earrings/watches/jewellery on swimming days. Transport to Settle Pool is provided by Bibbys of Ingleton and we will be leaving school after lunch on Wednesdays. Swimming tuition and transportation is provided by Sports Premium Funding.





Celebration Assemblies: Our Celebration Assemblies take place each Friday at 9am (unless parents/carers are notified otherwise). You are invited to join us to celebrate the children's' achievements each week.

Please arrive and leave by the entrance near the School Office and sign in on the sheet that will be on a clipboard in the hall and wear a visitors badge.

Specialist advice for parents of children with a Learning Disability Delivered by the Children's Learning Disability Team Craven




Join our specialist nursing team to gain essential advice and information for people with Learning Disabilities, including:
