Farm to Fork:

Robins Class had an amazing day at Hellifield School with the federation learning about where ourfood comes from for our 'Farm to Fork' topic. We explored different types of soils and what to look for to check the soil is healthy - we got to make mud shakes! We then became 'Nature Detectives' and explored the wood for mini beasts and made our own out of clay. We made our own mini-meadows which have been growing very well in school, after we have recorded our findings in our plant diaries these will be sent home for you to plant in your garden.



Starlings Class Starlings Class met with Class 2 from Giggleswick and Hellifield at Hellifield Primary School for an introduction to our Farm to

Fork topic. Members from the Yorkshire Dales National Park taught us about how soil is necessary for the production of milk. We went through the stages of cows eating grass, being milked, bottled and distributed to shops for us to buy – Parlour to Arla!
