## A Message From Miss Ward

It is lovely to see the lighter days and warmer weather approaching as we make our way through the month of March. We can't wait to welcome the children back. Here is a reminder of our drop off and pick up times:

Drop off times: Class 1 (8.50am) Class 2 (9am).

**Collection times:** Class 1 should be collected at 3.15pm. Class 2 should be collected at 3.30pm.

We are keeping our planned activities going as best we can and as the road map out of lockdown continues to progress, we are hoping that more events will follow! We understand that returning to school may be daunting for some but equally it is a time for reunion and excitement! If you or your child are worried about anything at all please remember we are here to help - just ask.

We would like to extend a big thank you to our Friends association for donating money towards a new set of books to share across our federation. These books are suitable in range for children from Reception to Year 6 and each tells a tale designed to encourage empathy. We are very much looking forward to reading these with the children and discussing the important issues raised linked to how we feel and how we treat each other. Our early reading scheme is having an overhaul and we can't wait to introduce some new phonetically decodeable reading books. We have been working hard over the last few weeks to update and develop our indoor learning environment. We have had a new floor installed in the conservatory area and

have reorganised the environment to include learning areas (sand, water, mark-making, construction etc as well as guiet areas for more formal learning). The children in school have been busy exploring the different areas of provision and we can't wait for the rest of the children to see our new classroom when they return to school next week. #### Class 2 update

We have also been working hard to tidy and sort resources and to move some of the furniture to give us a little more space. It might not look quite as different as Class 1's conservatory, but we think the children will notice a few changes. There are still a few things left to do before all the children return on Monday...

Next week in school, we will be continuing with the physical geography aspects of our Planet Earth topic, but also beginning to look at issues around sustainability. It is quite a few years since we achieved our Eco-Schools Bronze Award - it would be good to start thinking about how we could achieve the next level. We are also planning some learning activities based around the upcoming census. It's going to be a busy few weeks in the run up to Easter!

## Easter Holiday Club with Kanga Sports

Kanga Sports have now confirmed that they will be running an Easter club within the gov guidelines (So here is what they are offering):

- The club will be available for children who require childcare; this is if it supports a parent with being able to work or complete training.
  - (They will be operating set days for bookings to ensure that we have **NO** crossing over of bubbles, these will be 2 consecutive days or a full week booking)
  - Group sizes will be a maximum of 15 children
  - The day will be staggered start and end times with a single drop off
  - Children will be allocated an indoor space that is used by those children only for the time they are in and cleaned thoroughly throughout the day and the end of the day
  - Each bubble will be allocated a space for using the toilet and handwashing that is only accessed by them
  - All bookings must be made through the booking site so we can accept payments and collect contact information, so any contact can be made through e-mail/phone to avoid face to face communication between parents and coaches
