English

in English, we will be studying non-chronological reports, stories with familiar settings, and poems based on a theme. We'll be focusing on using punctuation correctly and expanding our vocabulary with exciting and interesting words!

Phonics

Phonics is taught daily – please look out for sounds and words to practice at home. Additional info can be found in homework books

DT

This half term, we will be making a moving story book! We'll be thinking about sliders and mechanisms, illustrations, using a design-criteria and evaluating our work!



Maths

Reception:

We're going to be learning about patterns! Can you find any patterns at home? Shapes, nature, number...

Year One

This term, we will focus on Place Value, Addition, Subtraction and Shape. Can ou find any shapes around your home

Music

In Music this half term, we'll continue exploring a variety of fun songs, including "Shake My Sillies Out" and "The Menu Song." We'll be thinking about how these songs make us feel, how we respond to them, and what messages they might carry. Children will also be developing their understanding of beat and hythm as they listen, move, and join in with the music.

Science

Animals

In Science, the children are learning how to identify and name a variety of common animals, including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds, and mammals. They are also learning to group animals based on their diets—whether they are carnivores, herbivores, or omnivores. Finally, we'll be exploring how to describe and compare the structure of different animals, including pets, to deepen their understanding

PSHE

Citizenship

We're going to learn about the importance of rules and why we have them, explore the different roles people have in our community, and understand what makes a good school environment—and how everyone plays a part in keeping it that way.

Computing

We are going to be learning how to use a computer — including how to turn it on, log in, and use a mouse! We'll be focusing on our mouse skills and also using a word processor!
