<p>Learning a foreign language provides a valuable educational, social and cultural experience for our pupils.</p> <p>It helps pupils to develop communication skills including key skills of speaking and listening and extends their knowledge of how language works.</p> <p>We aim to foster an interest in languages in an enjoyable and accessible way to stimulate their curiosity and support oracy skills, in particular, speaking and listening.</p>	<p>We teach French from Class 2 and enjoy learning about French language and culture.
