<p>Children will also learn to recognise and mistrust stereotypes, and to understand and respect cultural diversity. It is important to be aware of “difference” in a positive way.</p> <p>To know that there are other ways to live and behave which are valid, despite not being the same as the one that the child knows at home.</p> <p>It’s important to recognise that there are certain basic, fundamental truths that are common to our humanity, such as the need for honesty, trust and mutual respect in order for us all to live together in harmony. This links to our school values as a Federation.</p>	<p>Since the implementation of Global Learning, the school has also joined the British Council’s Connecting Classrooms programme.
