
MATHS

During the first half of the autumn term, the children in Owls Class will be undertaking work on place value, to deepen their knowledge and understanding of numbers and the number system. They will then be using the four operations and applying these skills, written and mental, to real life problem solving.

ENGLISH

SCIENCE

The first science topic of the year is 'Electricity'. During this unit children will be learning: about electrical use and safety; how to circuits using different components including a range of switches; and identifying conductors and insulators. Children will be making hypotheses and recording their findings in a variety of ways.

HOMEWORK CHALLENGES – English Comprehension and maths to hand in each Wednesday.

FRENCH

This half term we will be learning how to answer questions about themselves in French, revising numbers and days of the week and learning vocabulary related to school and the classroom.

MUSIC

This half term, our focus is on developing our singing, improvisation and composition skills, based around the song 'The Doot Doot Song.' Children will learn about musical structure and how to build chords.

HISTORY

Our history topic this half term will look at The Atlantic Slave Trade, considering what slavery means and using historical sources to investigate the journeys and lives of slaves. Children will learn about reasons the slave trade was abolished and study significant figures of the time. They will also learn that slavery still exists, even though it is illegal.
