### MATHS

During the second half of the autumn term, the children in Harrison class will be developing use of multiplication and division. Our year 4 children will also be looking at area. In year 5 and 6, children will also be studying fractions and converting units. All children will also continue to embed their knowledge of times tables.

### ENGLISH

We will be developing our writing skills through the following texts:

Children will be studying DT this half term with the aim of designing and making their own stuffed toy, considering the main component shapes required and creating an appropriate template. They will develop their use of blanket stitch and appliqué to sew all components together and add detail.

### SCIENCE

Our science topic this half term is Light. We will be looking at how light travels, how it is reflected, how shadows are made and conduct our own experiments to prove/disprove our predictions. We will also develop our scientific drawing.

### MUSIC

This half term, we will continue to develop our singing, composing and improvisation. We will be focusing on composing using Theme and Variation based on the well-known melody, *Twinkle Twinkle Little Star* and musical structures such Ternary form to organise and structure our musical ideas. As part of our studies, we will be listening to the music of Benjamin Britten, Mozart and Edward Elgar.

### Geography

This half term we will be looking at where our food comes from, biomes, how our food choices impact our environment and the importance of fair trade. We will be conducting our own field research to look at consumption, trends, the journey our food takes and the advantages and disadvantages of locally sourced and imported food.
